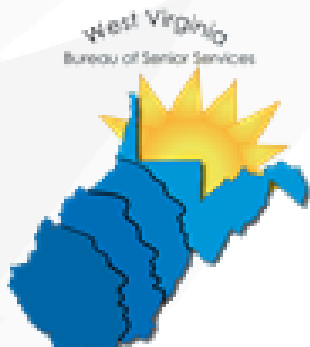


The Aged and Disabled Waiver program is an alternative to nursing home care.

The Program

The Aged and Disabled Waiver (ADW) program is an in-home care program for individuals who meet the nursing home eligibility level of care, but want to stay in their own community. Personal attendant staff come to your residence to assist with your personal care needs.

You must be at least 18 years of age in order to apply for the ADW program and be a West Virginia resident.

Application

To apply for the program, your doctor, a physician assistant, or a nurse practitioner must complete a Medical Necessity Evaluation Request (MNER). Services

- Case management
- Personal attendant
- Skilled nursing
- Non-medical transportation
- Medical adult day care
- Personal Emergency Response Unit (PERS)
- Environmental Accessibility Adaptions (EAA) - Home
- EAA -Vehicle
- Pest eradication



Eligibility

When you apply for services, a registered nurse (RN) will contact you to schedule a medical evaluation in your residence.



Eligibility (Cont.)

To be eligible, an individual must have needs in at least five areas of activities of daily living. Activities of daily living include the following:

- Eating
- Bathing
- Dressing
- Grooming
- Mobility
- Restroom assistance
- Other areas of need

To receive ADW services, you must first meet the criteria for both financial and medical eligibility. To find out more about eligibility, please visit www.wvseniorservices.gov.
